Sheriff Larry Campbell Consolidated Law Enforcement Presentation

Over the past few weeks Sheriff Larry Campbell has spoken with the City of Tallahassee Charter Review Committee, the Leon County Board of County Commissioners and many citizens on the topic of how law enforcement services are currently provided to the citizens of Tallahassee/Leon County. Since these presentations Sheriff Campbell has received many inquiries about the issue of consolidation of law enforcement services under one agency which would serve the citizens of Tallahassee/Leon County.

Sheriff Campbell said "since being elected Sheriff I have always advocated one law enforcement agency to serve the citizens of Tallahassee/Leon County. Not only does it make practical sense from an operational and fiscal perspective, but as our economy continues to decline and local governments are forced to look for ways to save money consolidated law enforcement is more prudent than ever. In Tallahassee/Leon County we have one fire department, one emergency medical service; why not one law enforcement agency?"

Sheriff Campbell has provided a brief presentation which illustrates some of the points he made during his recent speaking engagements.

Supplement –

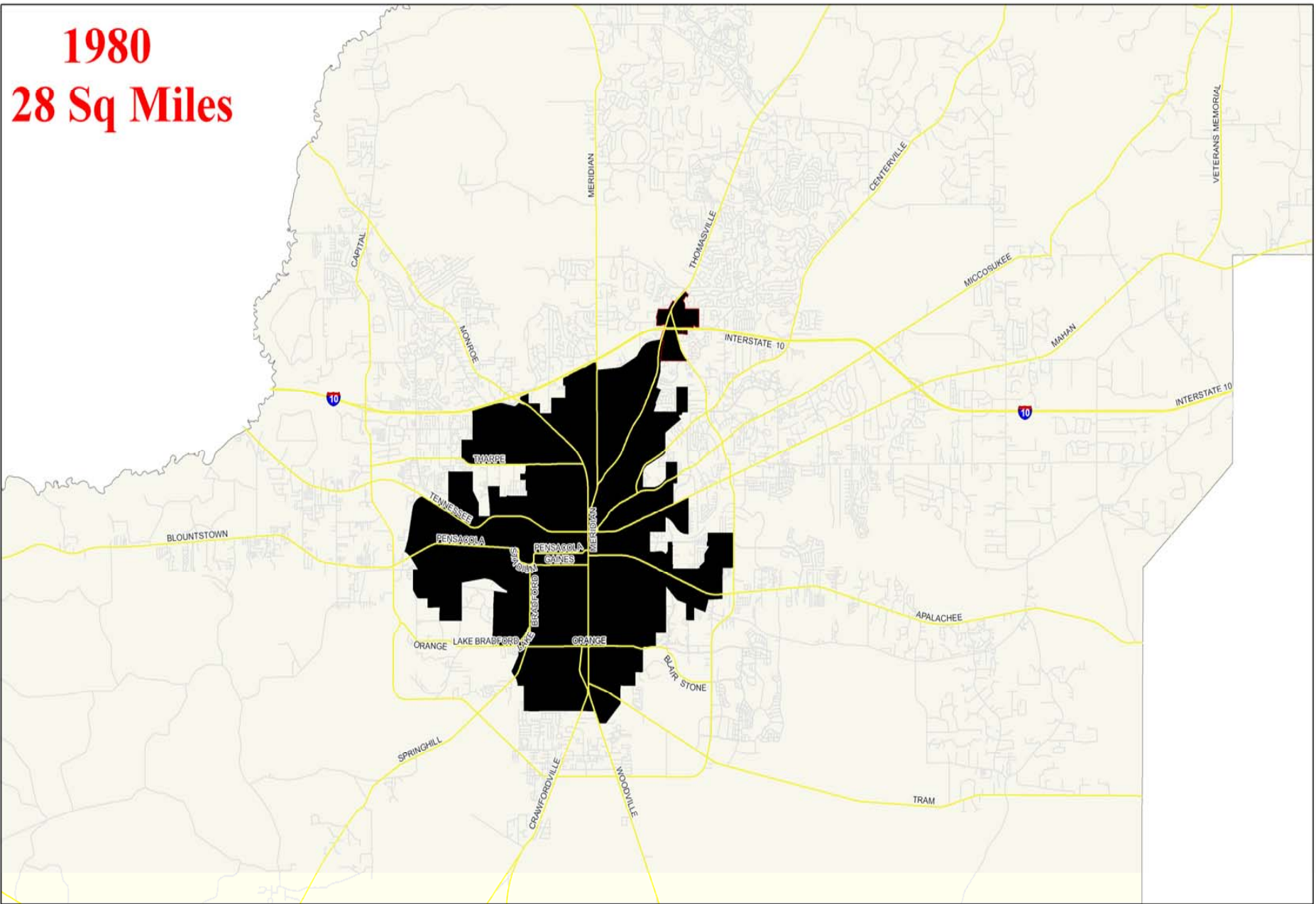
something added to complete a thing, supply a deficiency, or reinforce or extend a whole

De-facto Consolidation

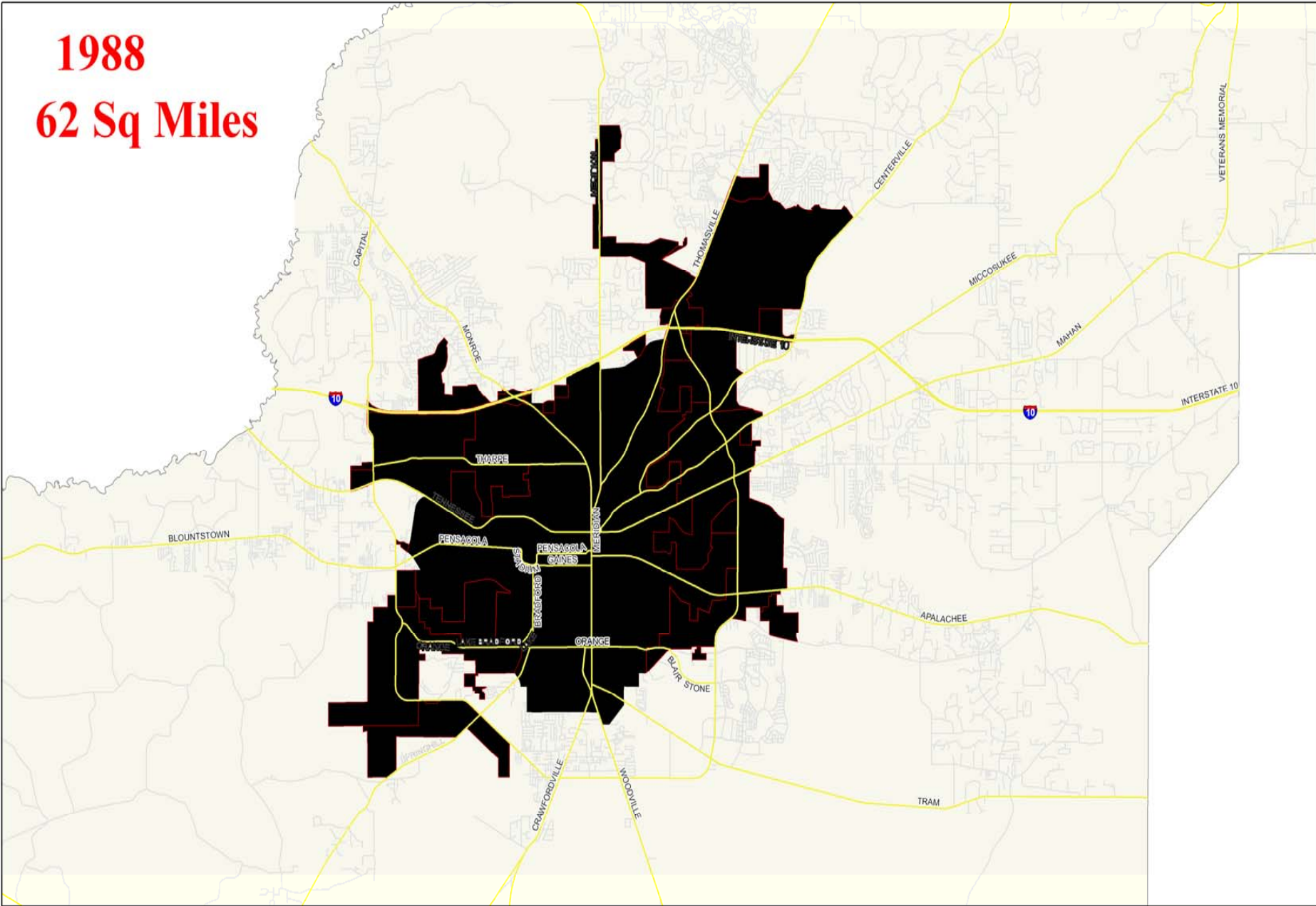
Our reality is a consolidation of sorts is being done every day through the City of Tallahassee's aggressive annexation.

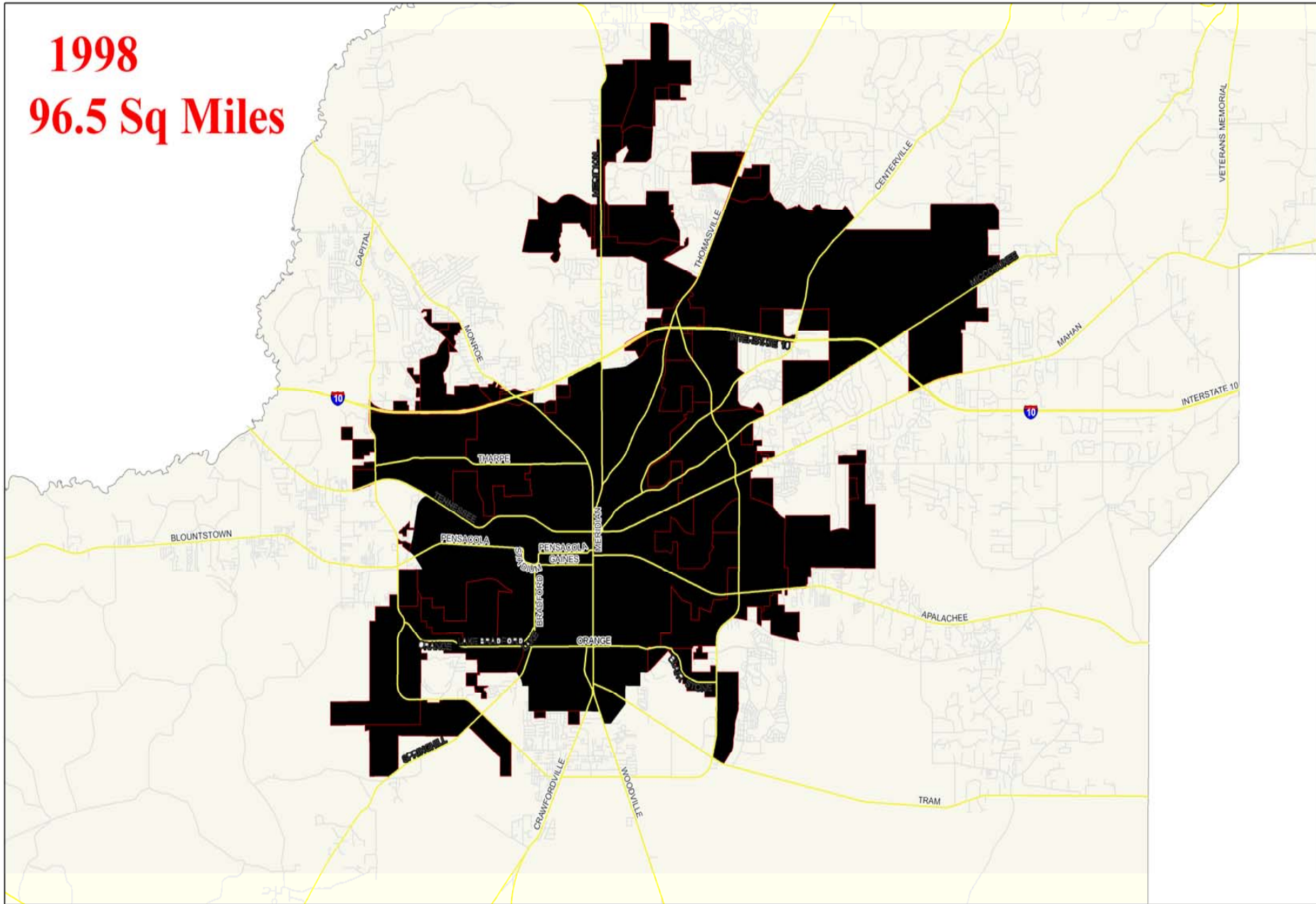

28 Sq Miles



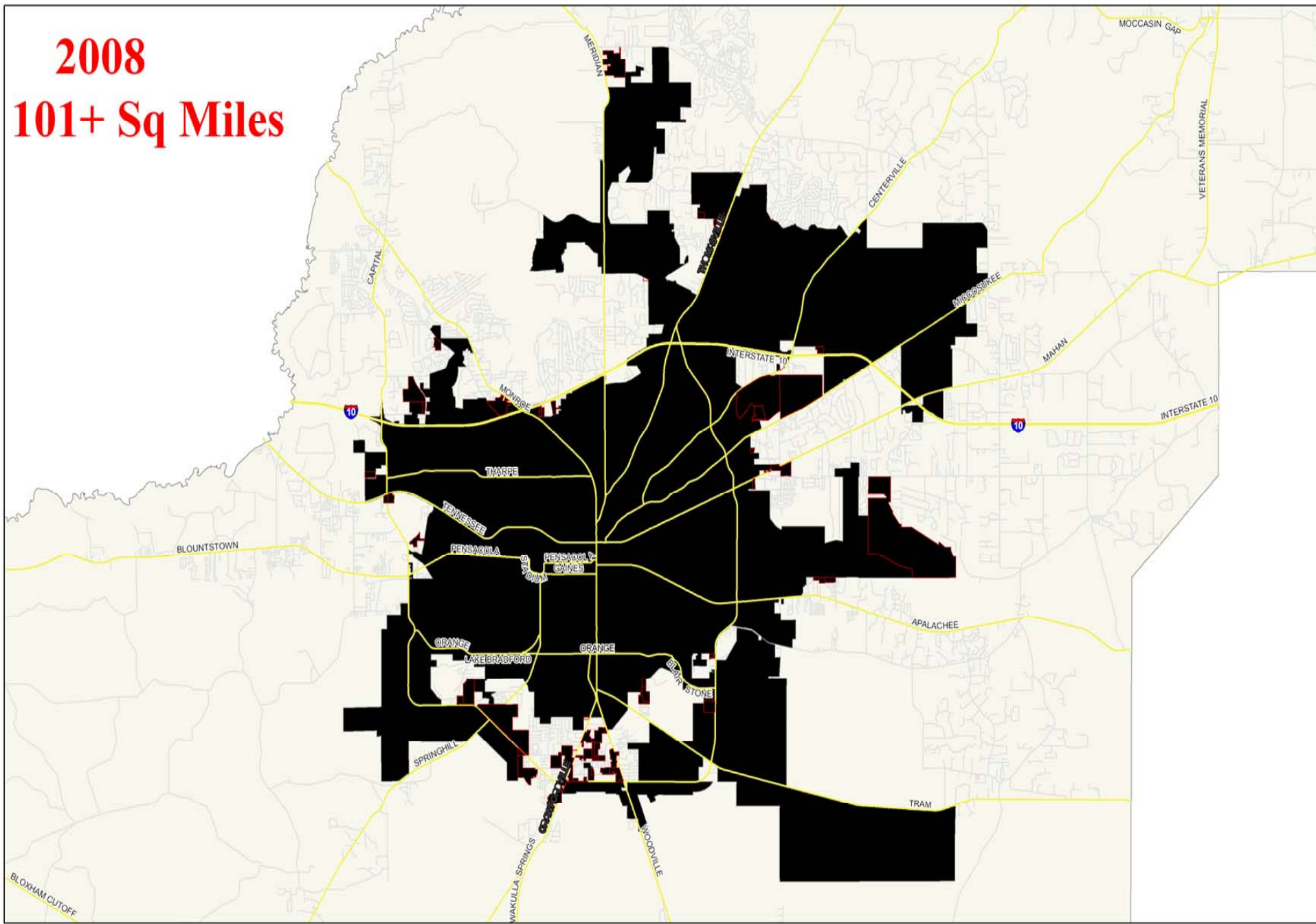

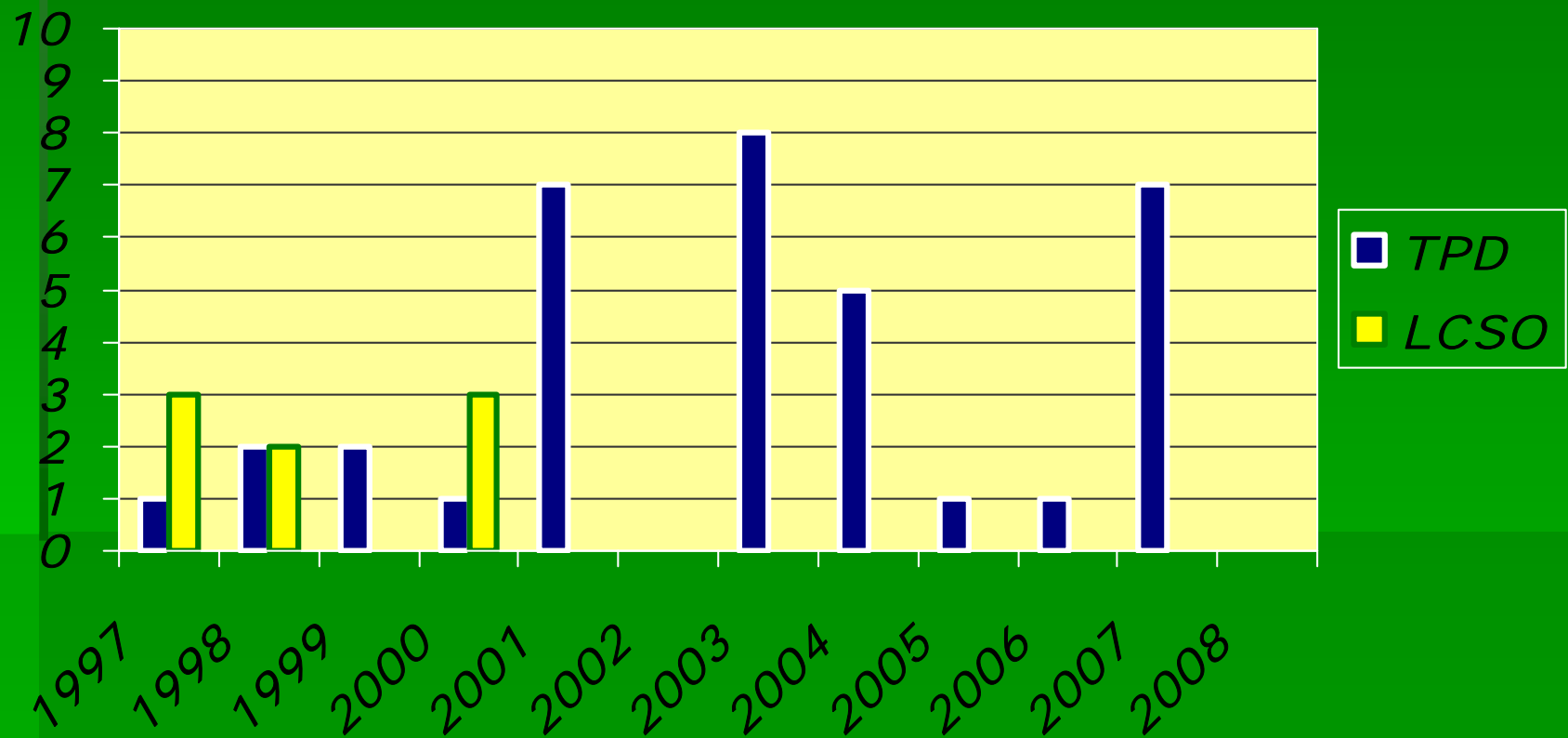

Combined Budgets of TPD and LCSO

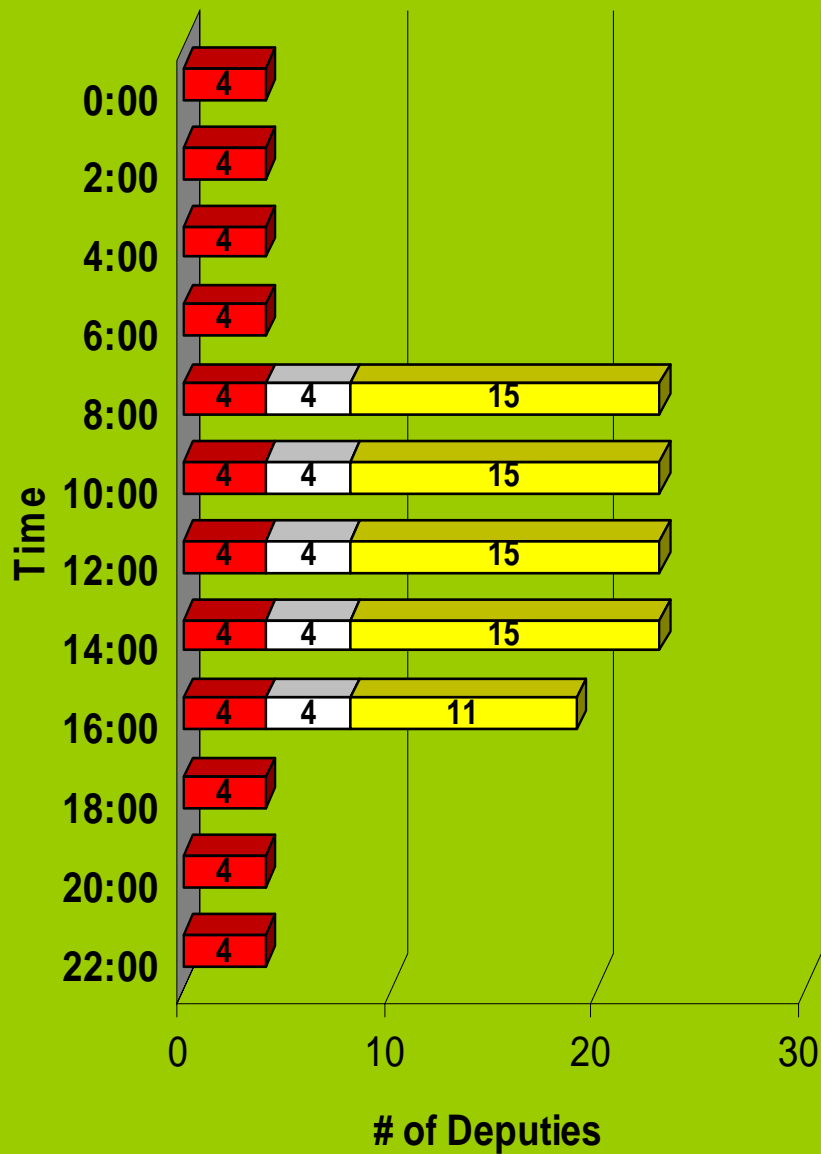
