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Update: Leon County Jail Inmate Death Autopsy Results

Yesterday at approximately 1:30 p.m., Leon County Jail inmate Calvin Torres DOB 06/21/1980 was being escorted from Jail Pod "B" to the medical unit for court ordered DNA testing. While in the area of the jail atrium and central control center, Torres experienced a medical emergency and lost consciousness. Jail medical staff administered CPR and utilized an Automated External Defibrillator in an attempt to resuscitate Torres. Leon County Emergency Medical Services transported Torres to Tallahassee Memorial Hospital where he was pronounced deceased at 2:10 p.m.

This morning Medical Examiner Doctor Lisa Flannigan conducted an autopsy of Torres to determine his cause of death. The autopsy revealed that Torres died of natural causes as a result of Coronary Atherosclerotic Disease, which in layman's terms, caused him to have a massive heart attack. Torres had a major artery which was nearly 100% blocked in one of the worst possible locations for such a blockage. Prior to Torres death, he had made no medical complaints related to chest pains or other cardiac related issues.



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
