## **Concerned Citizens and LCSO Team Up to Take Criminals Off Our Streets**

Yesterday, at approximately 2:00PM, a resident of the 1600 block of Silver Saddle Drive came home and discovered her residence had been burglarized and several items had been stolen, including a Wii game system and two laptop computers. Deputy George Stinson and Deputy Terry Ramon responded to the area and located Jacoby Hart DOB:1/31/1990, Ronnie Johnson DOB:02/16/1995, John Cowart DOB:01/12/1993 and Tommy Davis DOB:08/04/1992 in the area of the burglary and questioned them. They all denied any knowledge or involvement in the burglary. As they were being questioned a concerned citizen came forward and reported he had seen the subjects commit the burglary. When confronted with the positive witness identification, the suspects admitted to the burglary and led deputies to the stolen items. Hart, Johnson, Cowart and Davis were arrested and charged with Burglary and Grand Theft.

Then at approximately 3:00PM a concerned citizen called the Leon County Sheriff's Office to report three subjects burglarizing a home in the 1800 block of Cottage Grove Road. The citizen reported two of the suspects entered the home, while the third suspect acted as a look out. The suspects removed a large screen TV and fled the area. The citizen gave responding deputies a complete description of the suspects, including a description of the get-away vehicle, a tan Buick. Deputy Pat Lyons located the suspect vehicle at Old Bainbridge Road and High Road, which was occupied by Daundra A. Fishburn DOB:01/26/1986, Neville A. Laylor DOB:03/26/1986 and Cyrus Boykin DOB:07/15/1987. Located in the vehicle was the stolen TV and computer equipment and jewelry which was also stolen during the burglary. All three suspects denied any knowledge of the burglary or the stolen property located in their vehicle. But with the witness statements and the recovered stolen property Fishburn, Laylor and Boykin were arrested and charged with Burglary and Grand Theft.

Later in the day, at approximately 4:30PM, a concerned citizen called the Leon County Sheriff's Office to report they witnessed a strong arm robbery of a 66yoa male who was riding his bicycle on the St. Marks Bike Trail, about 1.5 miles south of Woodville Highway and Capital Circle. The victim reported he was riding his bicycle northbound when a young male pushed him off his bicycle causing him minor injury to his left hand, elbow and knee. The suspect then stole the bicycle and rode south towards J. Lewis Hall Park in Woodville. A concerned citizen observed this robbery and chased the suspect, forcing him to return the bicycle. The citizen then called the Sheriff's Office with a detailed description and followed the suspect to J. Lewis Hall Park, where Deputy Robert Betha located the suspect Xavier Curry DOB:11/06/1991. The witness and the victim both identified Curry as the person who committed the robbery. Curry was arrested and charged with Strong Armed Robbery

Sheriff Larry Campbell said "these are great examples of what involved citizens and law enforcement can accomplish when we work together to get criminal off our streets"

An investigation by the Leon County Sheriff's Office Criminal Intelligence Unit has revealed that Daundra Fishburn and Neville Laylor are documented gang members of "Lake Side" and Cyrus Boykin is a documented associate member of "Lake Side". This information will be forwarded to the State Attorneys Office.
