Robberies Possibly Connected

On Friday, November 14, 2008, Leon County Sheriff's Deputies responded to the Super Lube located at 1255 East Lafayette Street in reference to an armed robbery. The business manager reported that at approximately 7:30pm when he exited the store, he was approached by two suspects that had been hiding in some bushes. Both suspects were armed with handguns, threatened to kill the victim and demanded the night deposit bag. The victim complied and the suspects were last seen running southwest towards the Palms of Magnolia apartment complex, located at 1112 South Magnolia. In this robbery the suspects were described as black males, both approximately 6'1" to 6'2" with thin builds. One suspect was wearing a black jumpsuit style jacket with jeans and the other had what appeared to be a black sweater over his face and was wearing dark jeans.

Approximately an hour later at 8:30pm, Deputies responded to the Quick Stop Store located at 4784 Capital Circle Southwest in reference to an armed robbery. The store clerk and witnesses reported two armed suspects entered the store, threatened to kill the clerk and demanded cash. After receiving an undisclosed amount of money the suspects fled the store. The suspects in this robbery are described as two black males wearing dark clothing with ski masks. One was wearing a dark hoodie style jacket with orange writing on the front and had a beard.

Due to the similar descriptions of the suspects, the time frames between the two robberies and the modes of operation by the suspects, detectives have not ruled out that these two robberies are connected.
