S.P.I.D.E.R.'s Web Snares another Arrest

Just after 3 P.M. Saturday afternoon, January 4, deputies assigned to the Special Projects Investigations Detection Enforcement Response (S.P.I.D.E.R.) Unit observed a white Camaro driving west on W. Tennessee Street. The driver, later identified as 34-year-old Gregory Baldwin, was not wearing a seatbelt.

When deputies attempted to conduct a traffic stop on the vehicle, Baldwin pulled into an apartment complex in the 1500 block of Blountstown Street and ran from the vehicle. Baldwin was seen by deputies throwing a yellow bag, containing a dark colored object, as he ran away from deputies. Baldwin attempted to jump a fence but was not successful. He was then taken into custody by deputies.

Deputies located the yellow bag Baldwin had thrown and found a loaded Glock .45 caliber semiautomatic handgun inside. The firearm had been reported stolen to the Tallahassee Police Department. It was taken from an unlocked vehicle last year.

Deputies also located crack cocaine and cash inside the vehicle.

Baldwin is a convicted felon. He was taken to the Leon County Detention Facility.

The firearm has the phrase "Pembroke Pines PD" etched on the slide. The firearm did not belong to a law enforcement officer at the time of the theft and was no longer owned by the department.
